



## VHF QUICK REFERENCE GUIDE FOR COMMUNITY INFORMANT

Viral Haemorraghic Fevers (VHF) Case Definition For Use By Community Informant Any person who has an unexplained illness with fever and bleeding or who died after an unexplained severe illness with fever and bleeding.

BEFORE AN OUTBREAK		
SOCIAL MOBILIZATION	<ul> <li>Support health promotion and social mobilization activities including environmental sanitation and personal hygiene practices within your community</li> </ul>	
SURVEILLANCE	<ul> <li>Know standard case definition of VHF.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Based on your knowledge of the case definition, report all suspected cases and/or unexplained death(s) with or without bleeding to the Disease Surveillance and Notification Officer (DSNO) in your Local Government Area (LGA)</li> </ul>	
	Ensure you have the contact details of your LGA DSNO for reporting	
	<ul> <li>Enhance active surveillance including immediate reporting of suspected VHFs, public health events of unknown origin/ undiagnosed illness or unexplained death.</li> </ul>

SOCIAL MOBILIZATION	<ul> <li>Support health promotion and social mobilization activities in and around your community</li> </ul>	
SURVEILLANCE	Support active Case Search in your community	
	Report unexplained deaths in the community to the LGA DSNO	
	<ul> <li>Support LGA DSNO and Rapid Response Team (RRT) in Contact Identification and Tracing</li> </ul>	

AFTER AN OUTBREAK		
SOCIAL MOBILIZATION	<ul> <li>Continually support health promotion activities and social mobilization activities including environmental sanitation within your community</li> </ul>	
SURVEILLANCE	Active Case Search in the community
