
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 27TH JULY 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Six hundred and forty-eight (**648**) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from **21** states – Lagos (180), Plateau (148), FCT (44), Ondo (42), Kwara (38), Rivers (32), Oyo (29), Kaduna (21), Osun (20), Edo (17), Ogun (17), Ekiti (11), Abia (9), Benue (9), Delta (9), Kano (9), Niger (7), Gombe (3), Bauchi(1), Borno (1) and Imo(1).
- Eight hundred and twenty-nine (**829**) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in **13** states – Delta (584), Rivers (55), Oyo (37), Kano (30), Edo (25), Ogun (22), Lagos (17), Bayelsa (13) Kaduna (13), FCT (11), Kwara (9), Imo (8) and Benue (5).
- Two (**2**) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in **two** states – Abia (1) and Osun (1).
- All **36** states in Nigeria, and the FCT, have reported a confirmed case.

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK31)





Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK31)

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- **Received a total of 117 Persons of Interest (POI)/returnees from Ghana (37) on the 25th July and France (67), USA (5) and Turkey (8) on the 26th July 2020**
- **All POIs/returnees were received, screened and given the travellers kit on arrival at the Nnamdi Azikiwe International Airport Abuja (NAIA)**
- **All returnees were issued COVID-19 test appointment**
- **Trained 15 doctors from General Hospitals (GH), 20 hygienists currently working in the treatment centre and 600 Officers-in-Charge/Community Health Extension Workers (CHEWs) at the primary health care level in Ebonyi State**
- **Deployed Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), response materials and commodities to the North East states including the treatment centres, Teaching Hospitals and Primary Health care agencies in Gombe, Taraba, Borno, Bauchi, Yobe and Adamawa**
- **Distributed PPE and commodities to the GeneXpert laboratories in University of Nigeria Teaching Hospital (UNTH) Enugu, University of Abuja Teaching Hospital (UATH), Gwagwalada, FCT and University of Calabar Teaching Hospital (UCTH) Cross River**

- **Supported Universal Basic Education Commission to review the draft handbook on COVID 19 prevention in schools**
- Deployed NCDC rapid response team (RRT) to support Kogi State
- Commenced second batch of virtual Training of Trainer (TOT) on contact tracing and active case search
- Produced and shared jingles on COVID-19 preventive messages with states and Federal Ministry of Information (FMOI)
