

#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

## REPORTING PERIOD: SEPTEMBER 1<sup>ST</sup> - 30<sup>TH</sup>, 2021

- The Nigeria Centre for Disease Control (NCDC) continues to monitor reports of yellow fever cases in Nigeria.
- A total of 209 suspected cases were reported from 104 Local Government Areas (LGAs) across 19 states: Abia (3), Adamawa (10), Anambra (5), Bauchi (30), Benue (1), Borno (43), Ebonyi (5), Ekiti (2), Enugu (14), Gombe (4), Imo (11), Katsina (1) Lagos (3), Ogun (6), Ondo (19), Osun (4), Oyo (24), Taraba (8) and Yobe (16).
- A total of four presumptive positive results were recorded from Central Public Health Laboratory (CPHL) Lagos (3), and Maitama District Hospital (MDH) Abuja (1). The cases were reported from Ondo (2), Oyo (1), and Benue (1). Two (2) inconclusive results reported at the CPHL from Ondo (1) and Oyo (1) States
- Eight (8) new confirmed cases from Institut Pasteur (IP) Dakar from six states: Anambra -3[Idemili South (1), Nnewi North (1), Awka South (1)], Enugu -1 [Ezeagu (1)], Nasarawa -1[Akwanga (1)], Kogi -1 [Okene (1)], Ondo -1[Ifedore (1)] and Oyo -1[Orelope (1)]
- Three deaths were recorded among suspected cases from: Imo (1), Katsina (1) and Bauchi



## CUMMULATIVE FOR 1<sup>ST</sup> JANUARY - 30<sup>TH</sup> SEPTEMBER, 2021

- Cumulatively from 1<sup>st</sup> January 30<sup>th</sup> September 2021, a total of 1,518 suspected cases have been reported from 37 states including FCT in 428 LGAs
- The cases were reported from the following states: Abia (38), Adamawa [31], Akwa Ibom [5], Anambra [115], Bauchi [81], Bayelsa [25], Benue [35], Borno [166], Cross River [15], Delta [30], Ebonyi (31), Edo [46], Ekiti [8], Enugu [100], FCT Abuja [12], Gombe (6), Imo [58], Jigawa [30], Kaduna (3), Kano [20], Katsina [179], Kebbi [33], Kogi [16], Kwara [26], Lagos [8], Nasarawa [32], Niger [40], Ogun [26], Ondo [46], Osun [17], Oyo [62], Plateau [38], Rivers [19], Sokoto [6], Taraba [21], Yobe [80] and Zamfara [14] States
- All the suspected cases were reported from 428 LGAs across the 36 states and FCT. See Table
  (1)
- Total of 59 presumptive positive and 15 inconclusive samples were recorded from the Nigeria Laboratories
- Presumptive positives were recorded from CPHL Lagos (34), NRL Abuja (11), MDH Abuja (6), UNTH Enugu (7) and YDMH (1); these cases were reported from Anambra (12), Bauchi (2), Benue (5), Borno (5), Delta (5), Edo (1), Enugu (14), Imo (2), Kano (1), Katsina (1), Kebbi (1), Kogi (1), Kwara (1), Niger (1), Ondo (2), Oyo (5).
- Fifteen (15) Inconclusive results were reported CPHL (9), NRL (2), MDH (1) AND YDMH Kaduna (3), These cases were reported from Benue (1), Borno (1), Ebonyi (1), Edo (1), Enugu (2), Katsina (2), Nasarawa (1), Osun (1), Ondo (2), Oyo (1), Yobe (1) and Zamfara (1). These cases have been sent to IP Dakar for confirmation.
- Thirty-nine (39) confirmed cases have been reported from IP Dakar from: Anambra-6 [Ekwusigo (1), Idemili North (1), Idemili South (1), Onitsha North (1), Nnewi North (1), Awka South (1)], Benue-3 [Gwer West (2), Ushongo (1)], Delta-4 [Aniocha South (1), Ika South (2), Patani (1)], Enugu-14 [Nkanu East (11), Nkanu West (1), Udenu (1), Ezeagu (1)], Imo-1 [Ideato North (1), Kogi -1[ Okene (1)], Nasarawa -1(Akwanga (1), Niger -1[Munya (1)], Oyo-5 [Ido (2), Ona ara (1), Orelope (1), Oyo East (1)] and Ondo -2[Ifedore (1), Ondo West (1), Osun-1[Irewole (1)]
- Fourteen (35.9%) of the 39 confirmed cases were from Enugu State
- Ten deaths were recorded from Adamawa (1), Anambra (2), Bauchi (1), Benue (1), Imo (2), Katsina (1), Kogi (1), and Osun (1) among suspected cases (CFR=0.7%)
- Two deaths among confirmed cases from Anambra (1) and Osun (1); CFR (5.1%)
- Male to female ratio was 1.2:1 with males 825 (54.4%) and females 693 (45.6%)
- Eighty percent of cases were predominantly aged 30 years and below
- One hundred and sixty-seven (11.0%) suspected cases had at least one dose of vellow fever




Figure 1: Map of Nigeria showing yellow fever outbreak attack rates in affected LGAs, Epi week 1 - 39, September, 2021




Figure 2: Epicurve of yellow fever cases in Nigeria as at Epi week 39 September 2021




Figure 3: Trend of confirmed yellow fever cases in Nigeria 2017 - 2021




Figure 4a: Epicurve of yellow fever cases in Enugu State as at 30 September, 2021




Figure 4b: Map of yellow fever cases in Enugu State as at 30 September, 2021
