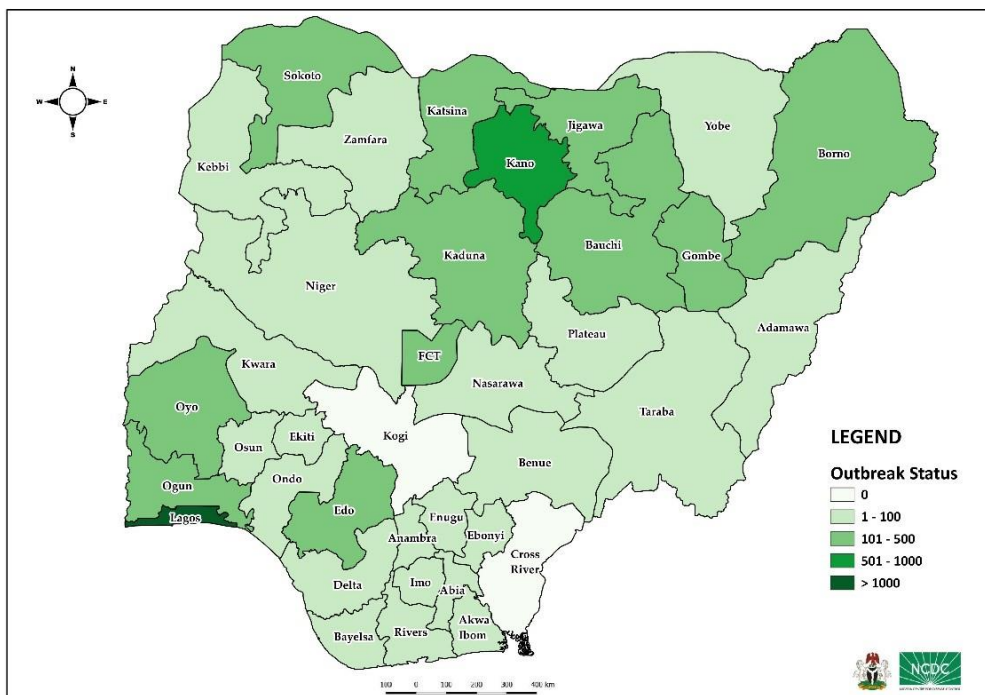
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC by Midnight 23rd May 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Two hundred and sixty-five (**265**) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours in thirteen (**13**) states – Lagos (133), Oyo (34), Edo (28), Ogun (23), FCT (22), Plateau (6), Kaduna (5), Borno (3), Niger (3), Anambra (2), Bauchi (2), Enugu (2) and Kwara (2).
- No new state recorded a confirmed COVID-19 case in the last 24 hours. The total number of states including FCT that have reported at least one confirmed case in Nigeria is still **35** (34 states + FCT).
- One hundred and sixty-seven (**167**) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in thirteen (**13**) states – Lagos (45), Borno (30), Edo (18), Kaduna (16), Gombe (13), Bauchi (9), Kwara (9), Oyo (9), Plateau (9), Adamawa (5), Ogun (2), Akwa Ibom (1) and Ekiti (1).
- No (**0**) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in all the states.

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK21)

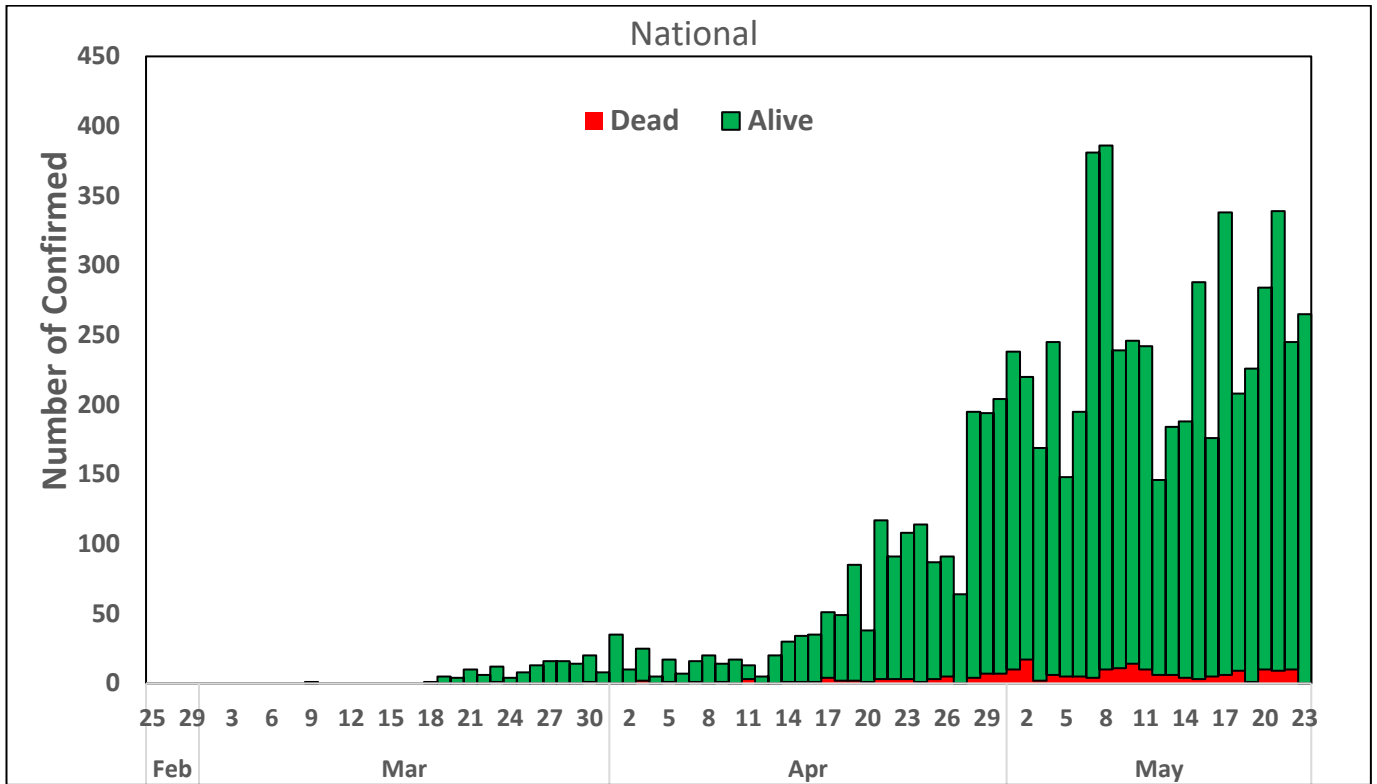
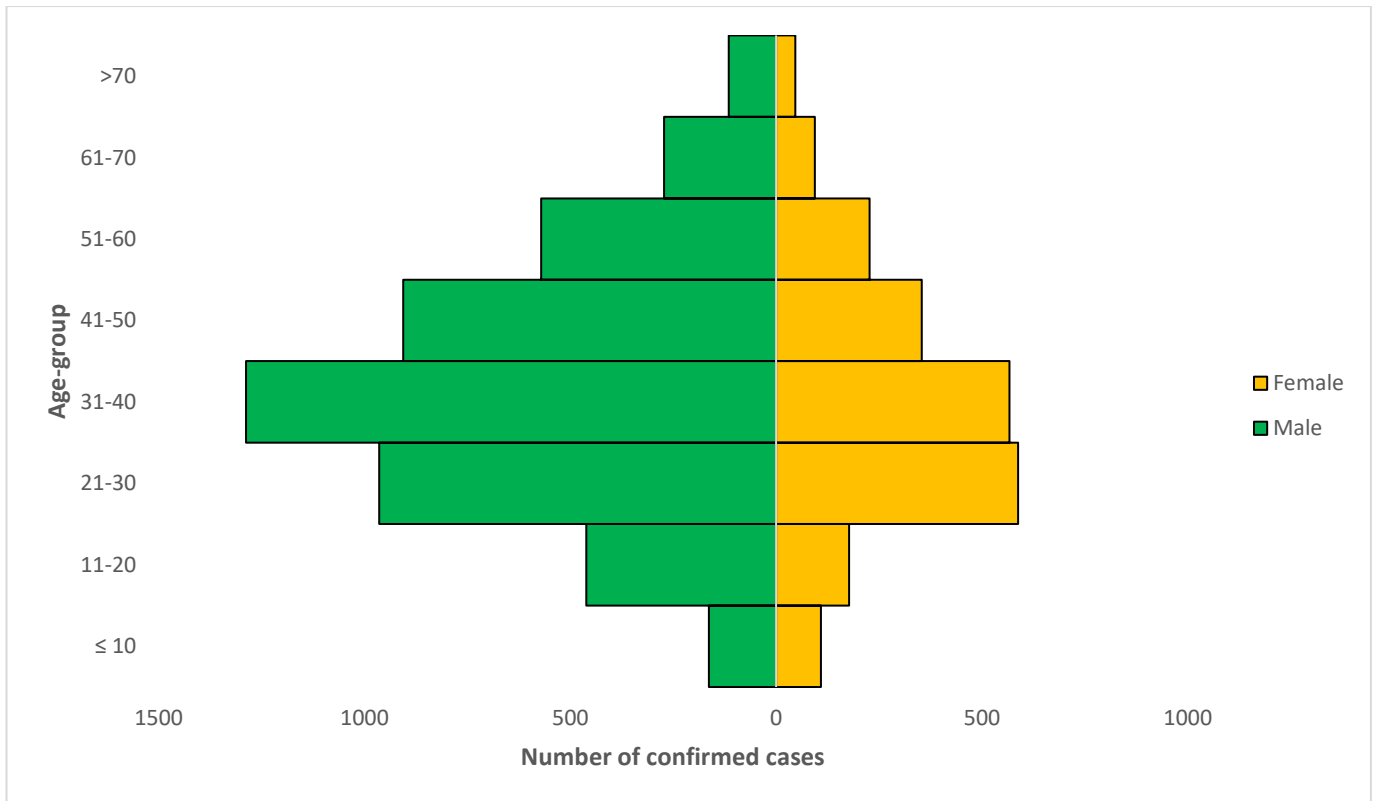


Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK21)



PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- Ahead of the Ramadan fasting period, an [Advisory for Ramadan](#) has been issued.
- NCDC releases periodic [public health advisories](#) to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an [advisory on the use of face masks](#), as well as information on the [Use of Cloth face masks](#) and [how to make your cloth face masks](#).

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- **Assessed the Armed Forces Isolation centre in Kano**
- **Engaged with traditional and religious leaders from 15 northern states**
- **Engaged with additional Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) to strategically expand the risk communications pillar stakeholders` base**
- **Completed commodities distribution to Isolation centres, Abuja, Port of Entries (POEs)**
- **Supplied Personal Protective Equipment (PPEs) essentials to the returnees**
- Commenced development of sector specific advisories on re-opening
- Conducted high level technical session on strategic outputs of Mid-Action Review (MAR) and identified priority activities for the next phase of the response
- Reviewed Epi-data at the national and subnational for targeted interventions
- Engaged the National Council of Women Society (NCWS) on the use of their expansive network for community sensitisation
- Developed strategic plan for grass root mobilisation
- Trained 101 health care workers on Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) in Owerri, Imo state
- Trained 25 health care workers in the military in Enugu state on IPC
- Developed and circulated the National COVID-19 mortality review forms to isolation centres
