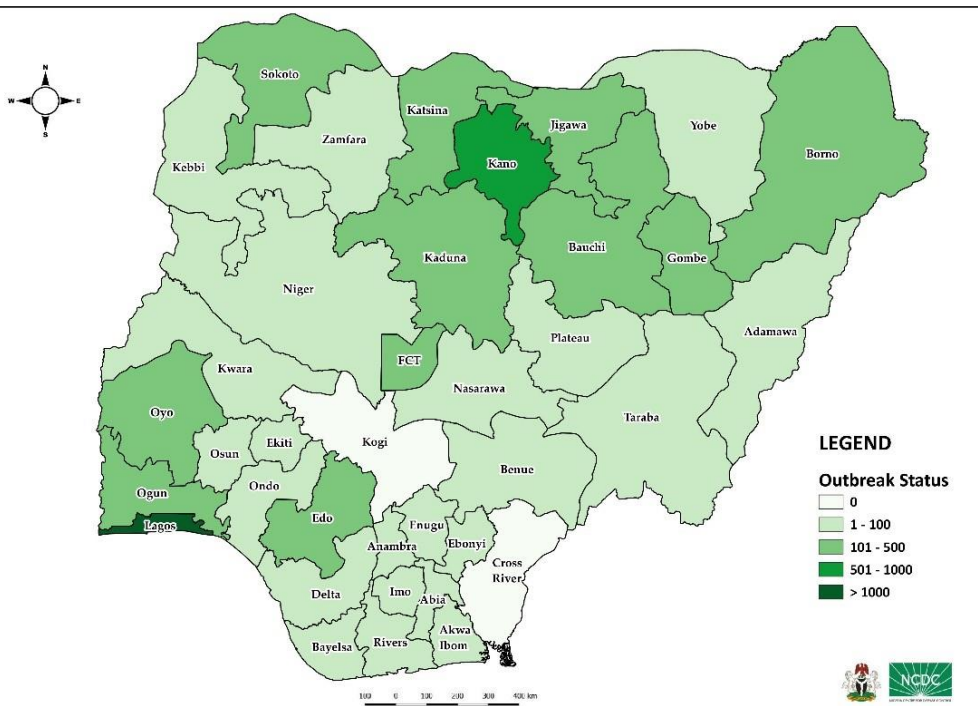
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC by Midnight 21st May 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Three hundred and thirty-nine (**339**) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours in eighteen (**18**) states – Lagos (139), Kano (28), Oyo (28), Edo (25), Katsina (22), Kaduna (18), Jigawa (14), Plateau (13), Yobe (13), FCT (11), Gombe (8), Ogun (5), Bauchi (4), Nasarawa (4), Delta (3), Ondo (2), Adamawa (1) and Rivers (1)
- No new state recorded a confirmed COVID-19 case in the last 24 hours. The total number of states including FCT that have reported at least one confirmed case in Nigeria is still **35** (34 states + FCT).
- Forty-seven (**47**) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in nine (**9**) states – Katsina (22), FCT (7), Edo (4), Ogun (4), Bauchi (3), Kaduna (2), Kano (2), Yobe (2) and Oyo (1).
- Nine (**9**) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in five (**5**) states – FCT (3), Rivers (3), Adamawa (1), Jigawa (1) and Nasarawa (1).

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK21)

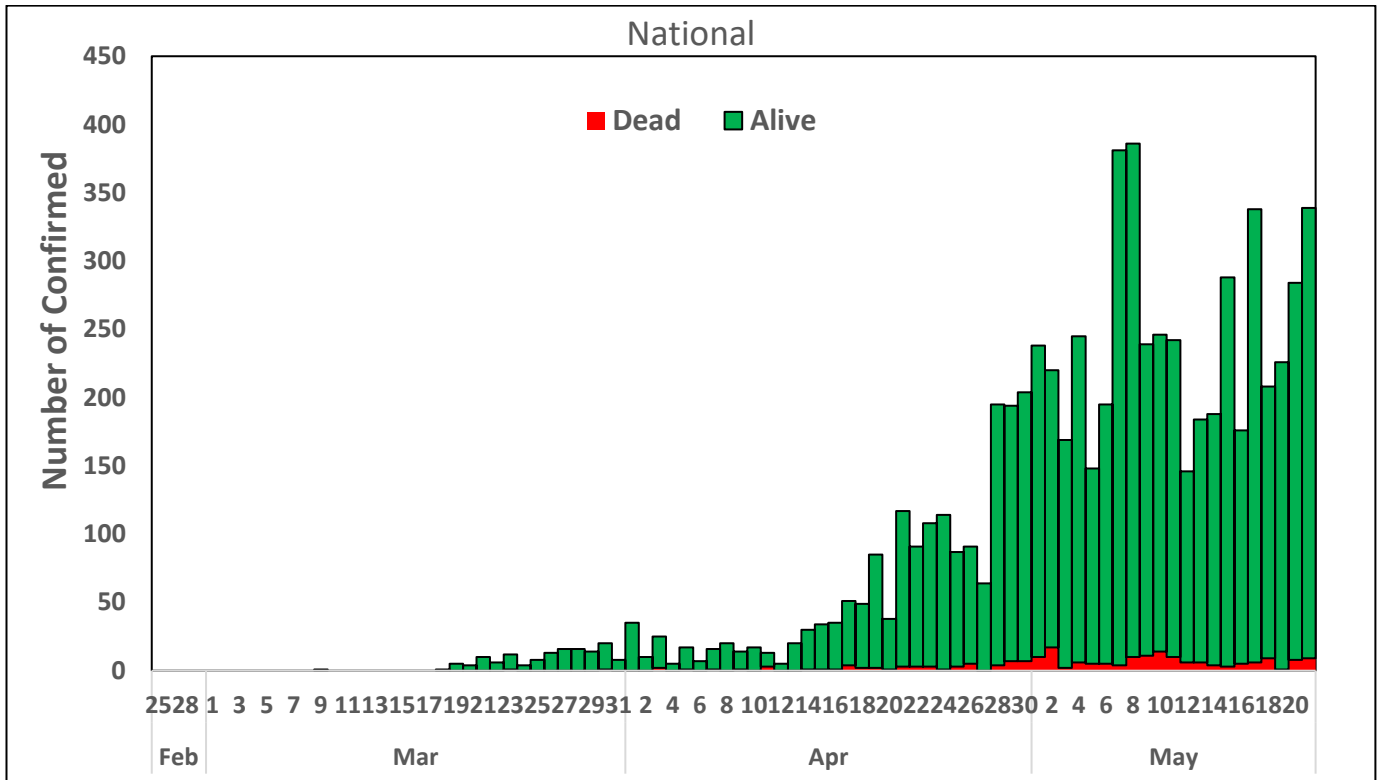
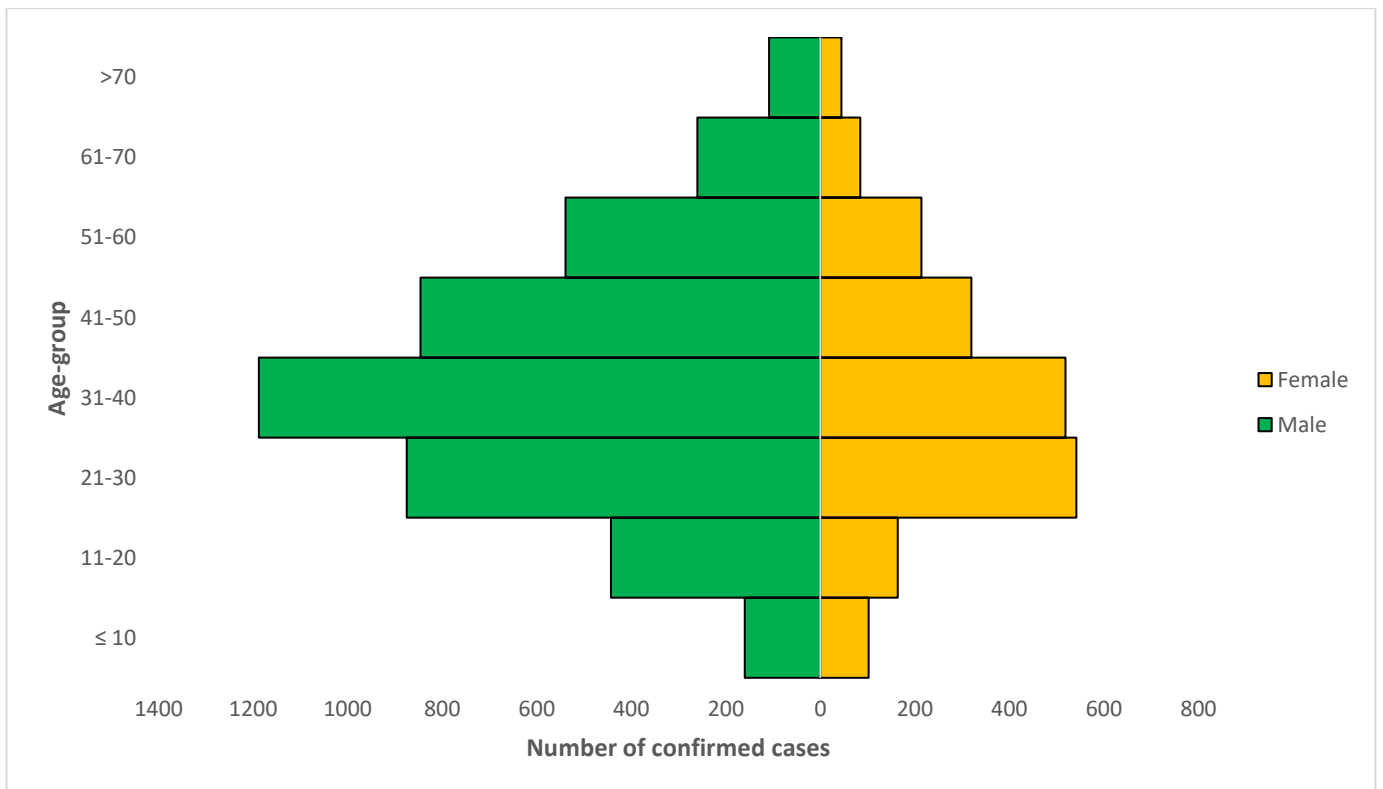


Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK21)



PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular respond to the pandemic

- Ahead of the Ramadan fasting period, an [Advisory for Ramadan](#) has been issued.
- NCDC releases periodic [public health advisories](#) to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an [advisory on the use of face masks](#), as well as information on the [Use of Cloth face masks](#) and [how to make your cloth face masks](#).

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- **Developed and circulated the National COVID-19 mortality review forms to isolation centres**
- **Completed the first phase of engagement with traditional rulers and discussed their roles in community engagement and curtailing the spread of COVID-19 in their domains**
- **Trained surveillance and laboratory personnel from 39 Local Government Areas (LGAs) in Kano state on safe sample collection, packaging, handling and transportation**
- **Completed commodities distribution to Oyo State Ministry of Health, Points of Entries (POEs) and Lagos University Teaching Hospital (LUTH)**
- Developed new Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) to track surveillance strategic directions and programmes
- Continued Monitoring of 977 returnees/ Persons of Interest (POIs) in Abuja and Lagos
- Trained 4th batch of Health Care Workers (HCWs) and Patent Proprietary Medical Vendors (PPMVs) in Kano state
- Reviewed strategies on preventing case mortality and improving data quality with case managers in the states
- Engaged with relevant Ministries, Departments and Agencies with partners for mapping of community mobilisers
